CMA CGM acts daily to limit the carbon footprint of its activities, contribute to preserving marine and terrestrial biodiversity, and promote a circular economy.

Accelerating the Decarbonization

Committed to reach Net Zero Carbon by 2050 across all activities, CMA CGM has set an ambitious decarbonization strategy based on two pillars:

- Reduce energy consumption through operational excellence and optimization of assets' design and performance.
- Increase the share of low-carbon energies in the energy mix, both by acquiring adapted assets and developing sustainable production channels.

For its shipping activities, CMA CGM is committed to reaching intermediate milestones: -30% of greenhouse gas emissions by 2030 and -80% by 2040 (compared to 2008).



The Group has decided to reroute its ships to avoid certain whale migration and breeding areas, notably the Hellenic Trench (Greece and Crete) and the Northern Route.



The CMA CGM Group renews its partnership with the Fondation de la Mer to preserve posidonia, lung of the Mediterranean, in four new sites in Italy, Turkey, Malta, and France.



CMA CGM continues its support to the Woods Hole Oceanographic **Institution** and its two acoustic buoys, which alert ships about the movement of North Atlantic Right Whales around high-traffic ports in the United States.



CMA CGM has once again been certified Green Marine Europe in October 2024. This environmental certification for the European maritime industry is a voluntary initiative. La Méridionale has also received the label.

The Group offers innovative transport solutions for more than 70,000 clients worldwide. Beyond their core businesses, CMA CGM and CEVA Logistics assist their clients in measuring the carbon footprint of their transport and contributing to their decarbonization by using alternative energies.

Since 2020, the ACT+ range has offered low-carbon shipping solutions that have helped reduce and compensate 520,000 tons of C02e from our clients.

By the end of 2024, CEVA Logistics launched a range of **sustainable logistics solutions**, CEVA FORPLANET, aimed at helping its clients improve the environmental performance of their transport and logistics flows.

In 2023 and 2024, CMA CGM received the "Supplier Relations & Responsible Purchasing Label", which rewards French companies that have demonstrated sustainable and balanced relationships with their suppliers.
